## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Nancy J. Brooks, of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month 2 be, and hereby is, granted to Nancy J. Brooks, of Lewiston, 3 to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' 4 pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hun-5 dred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise provided 6 by the legislature.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Nancy J. Brooks is the daughter of John T. Preble, a Civil War veteran. She is seventy-five years old, her health is poor and she has no means of support, except by charity. She lives with her daughter, who is a widow. Besides her father, she had four brothers who were in the Civil War, and both of her grandfathers were in the War of 1812; she had three grandchildren in the Army and three in the Navy during the World War. She feels that she should have a substantial pension on account of her needy condition and the large amount of service which has been furnished by her relatives in the Wars referred to above.
