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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

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AN ACT Relative to Inmates of Reformatory for Women  
When Incurrigible.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-one of chapter one hundred and forty-  
2 two of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking  
3 out all of section seventy-one and inserting in place thereof  
4 the following:

'Sect. 71. Any person committed to the Reformatory for  
2 Women whose presence therein may be seriously detrimental  
3 to the well-being of the institution or who wilfully and  
4 persistently refuses to obey the rules and regulations of  
5 said institution, may be deemed and declared an incurrigible.

6 Upon complaint to any judge of any municipal court having  
7 jurisdiction, he may upon hearing bind over any person so  
8 accused to the term of the Supreme or Superior court next  
9 to be holden, within such county, and if indictment is re-  
10 turned therefor, then upon conviction said incorrigible may  
11 be sentenced to the state prison for not less than one year  
12 nor more than three years.'
