STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Eastern Maine Orphan's Home,
Bangor, Maine.

Resolved: That there be and is hereby appropriated the
2 sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for the Eastern Maine
3 Orphan's Home, Bangor, Maine, for maintenance only for
4 the term July first, nineteen hundred twenty-five, to June
5 thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-six, and the sum of two
6 thousand dollars (\$2,000) for the term July first, nineteen
7 hundred twenty-six, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred
8 twenty-seven.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This is a home for orphan and neglected girls from the age of four to sixteen years, especially for central northern and eastern Maine.

Its normal capacity is about twenty-five and always has a great many more applications than there is room, and now there are twenty-nine girls in the Home.

It is under the care of the Sisters of Mercy, a religious community of the Roman Catholic Church, and its members devote their lives to charity and education. The Sisters in charge receive no salary and the same is true of the doctors and clergymen who attend to the needs of the institution.

A large property was bought a few years ago in order to build a home with a capacity of about one hundred, and this construction will be begun as soon as industrial conditions will permit.

The appropriation asked is the same as stated in the official budget, and is for maintenance only.

The institution sent its financial report to the State Board of Charities and was represented at the budget hearings, held at Bangor, November 1924.
