STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the University of Maine.

Resolved: That there hereby is appropriated to the Uni-2 versity of Maine, for maintenance, for deficiency reduction, 3 and for buildings, during the fiscal year beginning on the 4 first day of July in this present year, the sum of six hun-5 dred ninety-five thousand, one hundred twenty-three and 6 fifty-three hundredths dollars, and for like purposes in the 7 fiscal year dating with the first day of July in nineteen hun-8 dred and twenty-six, the further sum of eight hundred 9 thirty-one thousand, five hundred twenty-seven and nine-10 teen hundredths dollars.
