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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

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AN ACT to Amend Section Eighty-four of Chapter Eleven,  
of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Sales of Land for  
Taxes in Incorporated Places.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eighty-four of chapter eleven, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by striking out the word "may," in the second line thereof, and inserting therefor the word 'shall,' and by adding at the end of the third line thereof, the words 'or for which there is no other bidder,' so that said section, when amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 84. Estate may be bid off for town. R. S. c. 10,  
2 Sec. 85. The municipal officers shall employ one of their  
3 own number, or some other person, to attend the sale for

4 taxes of any real estate, in which their town is interested,  
5 or for which there is no other bidder, and bid therefor a  
6 sum sufficient to pay the amount due and charges, in behalf  
7 of the town, and the deed shall be made to it.'
