IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Forty-eight of Chapter Twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Powers and Liabilities of Plantations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-eight of chapter twenty-four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the words "chapter four" the following words: 'and plantations required to assess a state or county tax,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 48. Plantations liable as towns and have same powers. Plantations organized under section one hundred and thirty-eight of chapter four, and plantations required

4 to assess a state or county tax, have like powers and are
5 subject to like liabilities and penalties as towns respecting
6 ways. Their assessors have like powers and shall perform
7 like duties, as municipal officers of towns, respecting them.’
