STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Reckless Driving of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-two of chapter two hundred and eleven

- 2 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one,
- 3 as amended by chapter fourteen of the public laws of nine-
- 4 teen hundred and twenty-three, is hereby further amended
- 5 by striking out the words "one year" in the twelfth line and
- 6 inserting in place thereof the words 'eleven months,' so that
- 7 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 72. Whoever operates a motor vehicle upon any

- 2 way recklessly, so that lives or safety of the public are in
- 3 danger, or upon a bet, wager or race, or for the purpose of

4 making a record, thereby violating the speed regulations, or 5 whoever goes away without stopping and making himself 6 known after causing injury to any person or property, or 7 uses a motor vehicle without authority from its owner, shall 8 be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred dol-9 lars, or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding three 10 months, or by both fine and imprisonment; and if any per-11 son be convicted the second time for a violation of this sec-12 tion, he shall be punished by a fine of not less than two hun-13 dred dollars and not more than five hundred dollars, or by 14 imprisonment for not more than eleven months, or both.'
