STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the State Superintendent of Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, Sec. 20; 1917, c. 179; 1919, c. 147 and c. 215; 1921, c. 194; relating to salaries in the department of education, amended. Section twenty of chapter one hundred and ninety-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one is hereby amended by striking out after the word "of" in the third line thereof the words "five thousand dollars" and inserting the words 'seven thousand dollars,' so that said section, when amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 20. Salary of superintendent increased from \$5000
2 *to \$7000 per year.* The state superintendent of public schools
3 shall receive an annual salary of seven thousand dollars. He
4 shall also receive his actual cash expenses incurred in the
5 performance of his official duties, which shall be paid out of
6 such funds as may be provided for that purpose. He shall
7 appoint a deputy and shall employ such agents as may be
8 authorized by law and such clerical assistance as he may
9 deem necessary and as may be approved by the governor and
10 council for carrying on the work of his office. The deputy
11 state superintendent of public schools and the agents em-
12 ployed by the state superintendent in accordance with the
13 provisions of this section shall receive such salaries as the
14 governor and council may approve within the appropriation
15 made by the legislature and shall also receive their neces-
16 sary traveling expenses incurred in the performance of their
17 official duties.'
