STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Change the Personnel of the Budget Committee.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

That chapter one hundred and two of the public laws of
2 nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out all of section one and inserting in its place the fol-
4 lowing:

‘The governor-elect, state auditor, state auditor-elect, state
2 treasurer, the ranking member of the committee on appropri-
3 ations and financial affairs on the part of the senate who has
4 been re-elected a member of the next legislature, and the rank-
5 ing member of the committee on appropriations and financial
6 affairs on the part of the house of representatives who has

7 been re-elected a member of the next legislature, are here-
8 by constituted a committee to be known as the committee
9 on budget. In case no senator who is a member of said
10 committee is re-elected, then the ranking member of said
11 committee on the part of said committee on the part of the
12 house of representatives who shall be elected to the senate
13 shall become the member on the part of the senate. In
14 the event that no member of said committee is elected on
15 the part of the senate then the governor shall fill the va-
16 cancy by appointment from the membership of the senators
17 elect. In the event that no member of said committee is
18 elected on the part of the house then the governor shall fill
19 the vacancy by appointment from the membership of the
20 representatives.

‘The board shall meet and organize in the executive cham-
2 ber at the state capitol on the first Thursday following the
3 biennial state election. All members of the budget com-
4 mittee shall receive five dollars a day for the time actually
5 spent in the performance of their duties hereunder while
6 the legislature is not in session except in the case where the
7 governor-elect, state auditor-elect and state treasurer are
8 holding their respective offices at the time of the perform-
9 ance of their duties hereunder.’
