## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Increase the Salaries of County Commissioners for Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 42 of Chapter 117 of the revised statutes, as 2 amended by Chapter 173 of the public laws of 1917, by 3 Chapters 214 and 241 of the public laws of 1919 by Chapter 4 219 of the public laws of 1921, and by Chapter 103 of the 5 public laws of 1923, is hereby amended by striking out the 6 words "fifteen hundred dollars" in the seventh line of said 7 section, and inserting in the place thereof the words 'eight-8 een hundred dollars,' so that said section as now amended 9 shall read as follows:

#### SENATE—No. 46

'Sect. 42. Expenses at Hearings Away from County Seat
2 Allowed. The county commissioners in the several counties
3 shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the coun4 ties in monthly payments paid on the last day of each month,

5 as follows:

Androscoggin, seven hundred fifty dollars, Aroostook, eleven hundred dollars, Cumberland, eighteen hundred dollars, Franklin, four hundred fifty dollars, Hancock, seven hundred dollars, Kennebec, one thousand dollars, Knox, four hundred dollars, Lincoln, three hundred dollars, Oxford, six hundred dollars, Penobscot, twelve hundred dollars, Piscatacuis, five hundred dollars, Sagadahoc, four hundred dollars, Somerset, six hundred fifty dollars, Waldo, four hundred dollars, Washington, six hundred fifty dollars, York, eight hundred fifty dollars.

Said salaries shall be in full for all services, expenses and 2 travel, including the management of the jails and work shops 3 and the sale of their products, except actual necessary cash 4 expenses incurred outside of their respective counties for 5 the transaction of official business; and expenses incurred 6 at public hearings away from the county seat; all bills for 7 such expenses shall be approved by the clerk of courts and 8 the county attorney of their county; excepting also, such 9 expenses as are provided for in section twenty-six of chapter 10 eighty-three of the revised statutes.'
