STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Eleven of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred and Forty-nine of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen and Chapter One Hundred and Ninety-eight of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen and Chapter One Hundred and Four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Relating to the Salary of Stenographer of Kennebec Superior Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter one hundred and seventeen of
2 the revised statutes as amended by chapter two hundred
3 and forty-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and

4 seventeen and chapter one hundred and ninety-eight of the
5 public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen and as further
6 amended by chapter one hundred and four of the public
7 laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one is hereby amended
8 by striking out in the fifth line the words "Kennebec, eighteen
9 hundred dollars," and inserting in the place thereof the
10 words 'Kennebec, twenty-one hundred dollars,' so that said
11 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. The salaries of the stenographers of the superior
2 courts to be paid quarterly from the treasuries of their coun-
3 ties, in full for all services formerly chargeable to the coun-
4 ties are as follows: Cumberland, twenty-five hundred dol-
5 lars a year; Kennebec, twenty-one hundred dollars a year.
6 They shall also receive from the county in which the court
7 is held, their expenses when in attendance upon court away
8 from their places of residence, but not otherwise; a detailed
9 statement of such expense actually and reasonably incurred
10 shall be approved by the presiding justice.'
