STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Retirement of Stenographers of the
Supreme Judicial Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any court stenographer of the supreme judicial court who
2 has served as such by appointment in the supreme judicial
3 court or superior courts of the State of Maine for a period
4 of twenty-five years may at any time after he has arrived
5 at the age of seventy years resign his said office and appoint-
6 ment; or any such stenographer, who has served twenty-
7 five years as such in said courts, or either of them, may
8 resign his said office and appointment, and after such resig-
9 nation has been accepted by the justice of the supreme ju-

10 dicial court by whom he was appointed, such stenographer
11 shall, after his resignation and its acceptance as aforesaid,
12 annually receive as a salary an amount equal to three-fourths
13 of the salary received by him at the time of his resignation,
14 the same to be paid to him in monthly instalments from
15 the treasury of the state; and when any court stenographer
16 of the supreme judicial court has, through mental or physi-
17 cal disability or the infirmities of age, and after he has served
18 in such capacity for at least ten years, become incapacitated
19 for the performance of the duties required of him by stat-
20 ute, upon a certificate of such incapacity being filed by the
21 chief justice of the supreme judicial court in the office of
22 the treasurer of state, such stenographer shall thereafter
23 receive annually as a salary an amount equal to three-fourths
24 of the salary received by him at the time of the filing of said
25 certificate, to be paid to him in monthly instalments from
26 the treasury of the state.
