STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter One Hundred Fifteen of the Special and Private Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, It Being an Act to Regulate the Sale of Milk or Cream in Bottles or Jars, within the Town of Bar Harbor, Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1917, section 1, amended. Section one of chapter one hundred and fifteen of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen is hereby amended by striking out in the third line of said section the name of the town "Eden" and inserting in the place thereof 'Bar Harbor,' and by adding to said section directly after the words

7 “so sold or offered,” in the fifth line of said section, the fol-
8 lowing additional words: ‘and the milk inspector of said Bar
9 Harbor shall be subject to removal from his said office by
10 the selectmen of said Bar Harbor upon proof of any delin-
11 quency in the enforcement of this law,’ so that said section
12 as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. *Name of dealer must be blown into glass; milk*
2 *inspector to be removed from his office upon proof of any*
3 *delinquency in the enforcement of this law.* No person,
4 either by himself, clerk, servant, or agent, shall sell, or offer
5 for sale, any milk or cream, in bottles or jars, within the
6 town of Bar Harbor, Hancock county, Maine, unless the
7 name or initials of such person, or those of his principal,
8 are blown in the bottle or jar containing the milk or cream
9 so sold or offered. And the milk inspector of said Bar Har-
10 bor shall be subject to removal from his said office by the
11 selectmen of said Bar Harbor upon proof of any delinquency
12 in the enforcement of this law.’
