STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Protect the Fur Bearing Animals of the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. No person shall hunt, chase, catch, kill, de2 stroy, trap, or have in possession any fur bearing animals
3 of said state of Maine, or parts thereof, for four years,
4 from the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty5 five, except bobcats, Canada lynx or bear in open season.

This act shall not apply to fur bearing animals raised in 2 captivity, or belonging to private individuals.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall 2 be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars, or more 3 than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment of not more 4 than sixty days.
