STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Four of Chapter Five of the
Revised Statutes Relating to the Registration of Voters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section four of chapter five of the revised statutes is
2 hereby amended by inserting after the word "voter" in the
3 fourth line thereof the words 'in case a person who desires
4 to register is by reason of physical infirmity or disability
5 unable to appear in person at the place provided for regis-
6 tration, the board of registration or such member or mem-
7 bers thereof as the board may designate may attend at the
8 residence of, or at such place as said person is confined,
9 during the period that the board is in session for the regis-

10 tration of voters, and register such person provided he pos-
11 sesses all the qualifications of a voter'; so that said section
12 four as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. Every person whose name has not been entered
2 upon the voting lists in any city in accordance with the
3 provisions hereof, must, if he desires to vote, appear in
4 person at a place provided for registration and prove that
5 he possesses all the qualifications of a voter. In case a
6 person who desires to register is by reason of physical in-
7 firmity or disability unable to appear in person at the place
8 provided for registration, the board of registration or such
9 member or members thereof as the board may designate
10 may attend at the residence of, or at such place as said
11 person is confined, during the period that the board is in
12 session for the registration of voters, and register such
13 person provided he possesses all the qualifications of a voter.
14 Every person qualified to vote, as hereinbefore provided,
15 shall vote only in the ward of the city, and voting precinct
16 thereof, if any, in which he had his residence on the first
17 day of April preceding, or of his becoming an inhabitant
18 after said day.'
