IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Make Uniform the Authority and Fees for Services
of Officers in Criminal Matters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

All duly qualified state, county or town officers, having the
2 power of arrest, are hereby given the same powers and au-
3 thority in all criminal matters, whether felonies or mis-
4 demeanors, in their respective jurisdictions as sheriffs and
5 deputy sheriffs now enjoy; and shall be allowed the same
6 fees for travel and service as are now allowed sheriffs and
7 deputy sheriffs.
