IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifteen of Chapter One Hundred Seventy-three of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one and Chapter One Hundred and Seventy-five of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three, Relating to State School Fund Covering Unexpended Balances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifteen of chapter one hundred and seventy-three

- 2 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one and
- 3 chapter one hundred and seventy-five of the public laws of
- 4 nineteen hundred and twenty-three is hereby amended by
- 5 adding at the close of the section the following words: 'Bal-

- 6 ances at the close of the fiscal year deducted from the state 7 school fund and set apart for certain activities may be trans-8 ferred from one division to another by consent of the gov-9 ernor and council;' so that the section, as amended, shall read
- 9 ernor and council;' so that the section, as amended, shall read to as follows:

'Sect. 15. All unexpended balances of the state school 2 fund or of any funds or appropriations deducted therefrom 3 shall, at the close of the year for which said fund or appro-4 priation is available, be added to the permanent school fund 5 of the state. Balances at the close of the fiscal year de-6 ducted from the state school fund and set apart for certain 7 activities may be transferred from one division to another 8 by consent of the governor and council.'
