STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relative to Hunting and Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The common law right of the individual to
2 hunt and camp on uninclosed wood-lands belonging to an-
3 other, and the right to cross and recross such lands to law-
4 fully fish and fowl on great ponds, rivers and streams, shall
5 not be denied or abridged to any person in this state.

Sect. 2. No person shall be held to be guilty of trespass
2 who goes upon any such wild or uninclosed lands for any
3 of the purposes mentioned in the preceding section provided

4 that he does not commit unnecessary, wilful or wanton
5 waste, and provided further that he uses all due and reason-
6 able care to protect the forest when building necessary camp-
7 fires.
