STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Close Time on Lobsters in the Towns of Cutler, Trescott and Lubec, in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred fifty-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred fifteen, as amended by chapter thirty-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred twenty-three, is hereby amended by striking out all of said chapter and inserting in place thereof the following:

Section 1. No person or persons shall set any trap or other device used for catching lobsters between the first day of July and nine A. M. August thirty-first of each year, under a penalty of five dollars for each trap or other device

5 set within the following described limits: Commencing at
6 Township rock in said town of Cutler, thence running south
7 southwest, two and three-fourths miles; thence south south-
8 east, one half mile; thence south by west three-fourth west,
9 to the three mile limit; thence running along said three mile
10 limit to a point three miles southeast from West Quoddy
11 Head.'
