STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Sixty-eight of Chapter Eleven of
the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Collection of Taxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section sixty-eight of chapter eleven of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word "twenty" in the fifth line of said section and inserting in place thereof the words 'seventy-five' and also by inserting after the word "same" in the sixth line of said section the words 'and ten cents a mile travel for the officer as in serving civil processes,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 68. Before such officer serves any such warrant,

2 he shall deliver to the delinquent, or leave at his last and
3 usual place of abode, a summons from said collector or
4 treasurer, stating the amount of tax due, and that it must
5 be paid within ten days from the time of leaving such sum-
6 mons, with seventy-five cents for the officer for leaving the
7 same, and ten cents a mile travel for the officer as in serv-
8 ing civil processes; and if not so paid the officer shall serve
9 such warrant the same as collectors of taxes may do, and
10 shall receive the same fees as for levying executions in per-
11 sonal action.'
