## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Forty of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twentyone, Relating to the Farmington Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and forty of the private and special

- 2 laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one is hereby amended
- 3 by striking out the word "six" in the fifteenth line, and
- 4 inserting in lieu thereof the word 'seven,' so that said chap-
- 5 ter, as amended, shall read as follows:

'The judge of said court shall demand and receive the 2 same fees as are allowed to trial justices for like services

3 except that he shall demand and receive for a complaint and 4 warrant in criminal cases one dollar; for the entry of civil 5 action, fifty cents; and for the trial of an issue, civil or 6 criminal, one dollar for the first day and two dollars for 7 each day after the first occupied in such cause, to be paid 8 to him by the plaintiff in civil cases before trial, who shall 9 recover the same as costs if he prevail in the suit. All fees, 10 civil and criminal, shall inure to the county of Franklin II and shall be paid over to the treasurer of said county by 12 said judge on the first day of each month, except fines re-13 covered for the violation of the inland fish and game laws 14 of the state, which said fines shall be paid by said judge 15 to the commissioner of inland fisheries and game as re-16 quired by section eighty-six of chapter two hundred and 17 nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven-18 teen. The judge of said court shall court shall receive an 19 annual salary of seven hundred dollars in full for all serv-20 ices performed as judge of said municipal court, payable 21 on the first day of each month from the treasury of Frank-22 lin county. All expenses of said court, including blank 23 books of record, docket, and blanks necessary for the use 24 of said court shall be paid from the treasury of said county 25 of Franklin on vouchers approved by the county commis-26 sioners of said county, and said commissioners shall audit 27 and approve all accounts of said judge annually on the last 28 day of December, for the previous year.'
