STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Three of Chapter Three Hundred and Twenty-five of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-seven, as Amended by Chapter Seventeen of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nine, as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and One of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, as Amended by Chapter Thirty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three, Relating to Clerk Hire by the Judge of the Municipal Court of Waterville.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter three hundred and twenty-five
2 of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and
3 ninety-seven, as amended by chapter seventeen of the pri-

4 vate and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine, as
5 amended by chapter one hundred and one, section three, of
6 the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nine-
7 teen, as amended by chapter thirty-eight of the private and
8 special laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, is here-
9 by further amended by striking out in the eleventh line of
10 said chapter thirty-eight the words "five hundred dollars,"
11 and inserting the words 'one thousand dollars,' so that said
12 chapter thirty-eight, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Said court shall consist of one judge, to be appointed in
2 the manner and for the term provided by the constitution,
3 who shall be a member of the bar in Kennebec county, who
4 shall reside during his continuance in office in said city of
5 Waterville, and who shall receive from said city, in monthly
6 payments, an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars,
7 which shall be in full for all fees pertaining to his office;
8 provided, however, that he shall receive in addition to said
9 salary all fees allowed by law in matters relating to civil
10 business; and he shall have the authority to employ such
11 clerical assistance as is necessary, the compensation for
12 which shall be paid for in the same manner as the salary
13 of the judge, but the compensation for such clerical assist-
14 ance shall in no year exceed the sum of one thousand dol-
15 lars.'
