STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty-eight of Chapter Eighty-six of the Revised Statutes of Maine, Nineteen Hundred and Sixteen, Relating to Attachment of Real Estate in Municipal and Police Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-eight of chapter eighty-six of the revised statutes of Maine, nineteen hundred and sixteen, is hereby amended by striking out the words "and a recorder" in the second line thereof, so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 58. *Real estate may be attached on writs from certain municipal or police courts.* If a municipal or police

3 court has a regular seal, and has jurisdiction in any action
4 where the amount of damage claimed exceeds twenty dol-
5 lars, real estate and interests in real estate attachable on
6 writs from the supreme judicial court, may be attached on
7 writs, or taken on executions from such court, where the
8 amount of the debt or damage, exclusive of costs, exceeds
9 twenty dollars.'
