STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Four of Chapter Thirty-four of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Duties of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section four of chapter thirty-four of the revised stat-2 utes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:
3 'He shall, also in connection with, and with the aid of the
4 Maine Seed Improvement Association, annually hold a state
5 seed improvement meeting for the exhibition of seeds
6 adapted to the soil of Maine, wherein prizes for high merit
7 in quality and variety may be offered, and may employ
8 experts and lecturers to advocate the use of improved seed

9 by the farmers of the state, but the total expense for such 10 prizes and lecturers shall not exceed the sum of one thou-11 sand dollars annually. He may also in connection with, 12 and with the aid of the several poultry associations of the 13 state offer prizes for excellence in displays of poultry and 14 poultry products, but the amount of the same shall not 15 exceed the sum of one thousand dollars annually,' so that 16 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. He shall, in connection with, and with the aid 2 of the Maine Dairymen's Association, annually hold a state 3 dairymen's conference for the exhibit of dairy products and 4 appliances, wherein prizes for high merit and quality in 5 butter and cheese may be offered, and may employ experts 6 and lecturers to enhance dairy interests, but the expenses 7 of the same shall not exceed the sum of seven hundred dol-8 lars annually. He shall, also in connection with, and with 9 the aid of the Maine Seed Improvement Association, an-10 nually hold a state seed improvement meeting for the ex-11 hibition of seeds adapted to the soil of Maine, wherein 12 prizes for high merit in quality and variety may be offered, 13 and may employ experts and lecturers to advocate the use 14 of improved seed by the farmers of the state, but the total 15 expense for such prizes and lecturers shall not exceed the 16 sum of one thousand dollars annually. He may also in 17 connection with, and with the aid of the several poultry 18 associations of the state offer prizes for excellence in dis-19 plays of poultry and poultry products, but the amount of 20 the same shall not exceed the sum of one thousand dollars 21 annually.'
