STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

 AN ACT to Prevent Traveling Pedlars, Dealers, Salesmen and Solicitors of Orders for Punch Boards, Seal Cards, Slot
 Gambling Machines or Other Implements, Apparatus or Materials of Any Form of Gambling.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
No person shall travel from town to town, or from place
2 to place, in any city, town or plantation, on foot or by pri3 vate or public conveyance, either by land or water, carry4 ing for sale, offering for sale, or offering to obtain for sale,
5 any punch board, seal card, slot gambling machine or other
6 implements, apparatus or materials of any form of gam7 bling, and no person shall solicit, obtain or offer to obtain

8 orders for the sale or delivery of any punch board, seal 9 card, slot gambling machine or other implements, apparatus 10 or material of gambling. Any person violating the pro-11 visions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not 12 more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not 13 more than four months; and the municipal officers, con-14 stables and police officers of towns and cities, the assessors 15 of plantations and licensed private detectives are required 16 promptly to enforce the provisions of this act and to make 17 complaint against any person in their respective municipali-18 ties where there is probable cause to believe such person 19 to be guilty of a violation of this act. Trial justices and 20 judges of municipal or police courts shall have jurisdiction 21 in all prosecutions for violation of this act.
