STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE**

AN ACT Relating to the Payment of the Costs in Transporting Persons to the State School for Girls, the Maine School for Feeble Minded, Reformatory for Women and the Reformatory for Men.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The costs of transporting a girl to or from the State School
2 for Girls, or of a person to or from the Maine School for
3 Feeble Minded, or of a woman to or from the Reformatory
4 for Women, or of a man to or from the Reformatory for
5 Men, shall, when not otherwise provided for, be paid from
6 the treasury of the county from which such person is com-

7 mitted as the costs of conveying prisoners to the jails are
8 paid; and the county commissioners of such county shall
9 examine and allow all such reasonable costs.
