## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE. HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty of Chapter One Hundred Ninety-six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to License for Trapping Fur-Bearing Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section fifty of chapter one hundred ninety-six of the pub2 lic laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby amend3 ed by striking out all of said section and substituting there4 for the following section:

'Sect. 50. License fee to trap fur-bearing animals in un-2 organized townships shall be ten dollars, but said fee shall 3 not be required of members of the Penobscot and Passa-4 maquoddy tribes of Indians, resident in Maine.

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'Whoever except members of the Penobscot or Passama-2 quoddy tribes of Indians resident in Maine, captures or 3 traps any fur-bearing animals, except bobcats, loupcervier, 4 Canada lynx or bears, in any of the unorganized townships 5 of the state shall annually procure a license therefor from 6 the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, paying there-7 for a fee of ten dollars; provided, further, that whoever 8 hunts, captures or traps any beaver in any territory opened 9 to beaver trapping by said commissioner shall pay therefor 10 a fee of twenty-five dollars annually. Each person licensed 11 under the provisions of this section shall, on or before the 12 fifteenth day of December of each year, make such report 13 to said commissioner as may be called for by him. Who-14 ever violates any provision of this section shall pay a fine 15 of one hundred dollars and costs for each offense.'
