STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the Postmaster of the
House.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section fourteen of chapter one hundred and
2 seventeen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by in-
3 serting after the word "messenger" in the twelfth line there-
4 of the words 'and postmaster,' and by striking out the word
5 "postmaster" in the thirteenth line and by inserting the word
6 'each' after the word "shall" in twelfth line, so that said
7 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 14. The clerk of the house of representatives shall
2 perform the usual duties of his office during the session of
3 the legislature, and index and supervise the publication of

4 the house journal. He shall also perform the services re-
5 quired of him by sections thirty-one and thirty-four of chap-
6 ter two. He shall receive a salary of fourteen hundred
7 dollars in full for all official services by him performed
8 during the term for which he is chosen, as follows: eleven
9 hundred dollars at the close of the session of the legislature,
10 and three hundred dollars when the journal of the house
11 is completed.

The assistant clerk of the house shall receive a salary of
2 six hundred dollars; his work shall be performed under the
3 direction of the clerk.

The messenger and postmaster shall each receive a salary
2 of four hundred dollars; the assistant messenger, document
3 clerk, first folder, second folder, mailcarrier and doorkeeper
4 shall each receive a salary of three hundred dollars; the
5 pages shall each receive a salary of one hundred and fifty
6 dollars; the official reporter of the house shall receive a sal-
7 ary of one thousand dollars.

All of the above mentioned officers shall work under the
2 direction of the speaker of the house. The above salaries
3 shall be in full for all official services by them performed
4 during the term for which they are chosen, and no other
5 compensation shall be allowed them, except in case of an
6 adjourned or special session of the legislature.

Sect. 2. The increase herein provided for shall apply to
2 the postmaster of this, the eighty-second legislature.
