STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in the Aroostook River and Tributaries in Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill any trout, salmon or landlocked salmon
3 at any time in any of the tributaries to the Aroostook river
4 above the Caribou dam, so-called, in the county of Aroos-
5 took.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to fish for, take,
2 catch or kill any kind of fish at any time on or through the
3 ice in the Aroostook river or any of its tributaries above
4 said Caribou dam.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in any of the above named waters in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and one dollar additional for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. Trial justices, police and municipal courts, within their respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial courts and superior courts in all prosecutions arising under this act.
