### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Northern Maine Sanatorium.

Resolved: That the sum of seven thousand dollars be appropriated for the Northern Maine Sanatorium, for the period commencing July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-4 five, and ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-5 ty-six, divided as follows: Five thousand dollars for laundry and equipment; and two thousand dollars for ice house and stable.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. It is costing five hundred dollars per month to have the laundry work kept up. In institutions of similar character which are equipped with a laundry the work is being done at a cost of one hundred and fifty dollars per month. It is a business proposition for the state to grant this money because the saving will take care of the amount in two years.
- II. By adding two new buildings since the ice house was constructed the storage is insufficient and it will be much cheaper to construct this building than to buy ice and convey it from the village, a distance of three miles. The stable can be built in conjunction with the ice house. This is necessary as there is no stable within a quarter of a mile of the sanatorium. In the winter season those visiting the institution are caused great inconvenience, especially those visiting their friends.
