STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Frank H.
Taylor, of Whitefield.

Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Frank H. Taylor, of Whitefield,
3 to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for sol-
4 diers' pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nine-
5 teen hundred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise
6 provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Frank H. Taylor is the brother of Eugene Taylor, who served in the Civil War from October 1, 1862, to June 16, 1865. His father, Dudley H. Taylor, served in the Mexican War in the 45th Regiment of United States Infantry.

Frank H. Taylor is a cripple and has a family of small children. He has lived in the town of Whitefield for the last 35 years. He has no means of taking care of his family.
