AN ACT to Ratify the Plantation Meeting of The Forks
Plantation.

Whereas, the plantation meeting of the plantation of The Forks, located in the county of Somerset, was held upon the second day of March, A. D. nineteen hundred and twenty-five, at the Franklin schoolhouse, so-called, in said plantation, and

Whereas, some question as to the legality of the holding of said meeting and of the doings thereat, has arisen, and

Whereas, in the event that such meeting was not legally holden, great and grave injustice would result, and

Whereas, in the opinion of the legislature, these facts render the immediate passage of this act necessary for the preser-

vation of the public peace, health and safety and constitute an emergency within the meaning of the constitution, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The plantation meeting of The Forks Plantation held on the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, is hereby ratified, made legal, and valid, and all the proceedings of said meeting are hereby ratified, made legal, and valid.

Sect. 2. In view of the emergency recited in the preamble hereof, this act shall take effect when approved.
