In Senate.....

Ordered, the House concurring, that the "Oakes-Anthoine Bill" being an act entitled, "An Act to Provide the Method of Nominating Candidates for Office," hereto attached, the same being a measure combining the features of primary elections and the convention system, so-called, be printed for public distribution.

Be it further ordered that the following question be submitted to the electors at any election called for by the provisions of an initiated measure entitled, "An Act to Repeal Sections One to Thirty-six of Chapter Six of the Revised Statutes,

Relative to Primary Elections.” And that the said “Oakes-Anthoine Bill” shall be a competing measure therewith; “Shall the so-called ‘Oakes-Anthoine Bill’ being a measure embracing the features of primary elections and a convention system so-called be the Law?”
