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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

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AN ACT to Provide for an Assistant County Attorney for  
the County of Androscoggin.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The county attorney of the county of Androscoggin may  
2 appoint an assistant, to be approved by the justice of the  
3 superior court for said county. Said assistant shall take  
4 the oath prescribed for county attorneys; and assist the  
5 county attorney in the ordinary duties of his office, in the  
6 drawing of indictments, in the hearing of complaints be-  
7 fore the grand jury, and in the preparation and trial of  
8 criminal causes. He shall, when directed by the county  
9 attorney, act as counsel for the state in the trial of com-  
10 plaints, before judges of municipal and police courts and

11 trial justices. Said assistant county attorney shall receive  
12 an annual salary of eight hundred dollars payable from the  
13 state treasury in monthly payments on the last day of each  
14 month. The assistant county attorney shall hold his office  
15 during the term of the county attorney by whom he was  
16 appointed, subject to removal at any time by the justice of  
17 the superior court for said county.
