STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE**

**AN ACT Making it Unlawful for Any Person to Have In-
toxicating Liquors in His Possession in Any Public Place.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person, except an agent of
2 enforcement who is lawfully in possession of intoxicating
3 liquors to be used as evidence, to have in his possession in
4 any public place any intoxicating liquors unless duly li-
5 censed under a written permit authorized by act of congress.

For the purposes of this act every place shall be deemed
2 a public place except a dwelling house regularly occupied
3 as a residence or a summer cottage regularly occupied as a
4 summer residence or that part of a hotel, boarding or lodging
5 house used as a permanent residence.

In any proceeding under this section it shall not be incumbent on the state to allege and prove that such person was not in possession of such permit.
