**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE**

AN ACT Relating to Amateur Boxing Contests.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section four of chapter one hundred twenty-five of the
2 revised statutes of nineteen hundred sixteen shall not apply
3 to amateur boxing contests of not more than four rounds
4 of three minutes each, in which new six-ounce gloves are
5 used which have not been broken, or tampered with by
6 pushing back the padding from the knuckles of said gloves,
7 and where there is not more than five pounds difference in
8 the weight of the contestants and where contestants have
9 had a rigid physical examination by a reputable physician
10 just prior to said contest and said physician certifies that

11 each of said contestants is in good physical condition. De-
12 cisions may be given in such amateur boxing contests con-
13 ducted by organizations incorporated under section one of
14 chapter sixty-two of the revised statutes of nineteen hun-
15 dred sixteen as amended, provided the receipts from such
16 amateur boxing contests are to be paid into the treasury
17 of such organization or to some public charity. For the
18 purposes of this act an amateur boxing contest is a contest
19 between boxers who never have taken cash prizes in boxing
20 contests, in which no other prizes than medals or merchan-
21 dise are awarded.
