STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Insurance upon Lives of Directors, Officers, Agents and Employes of Corporations and Prescribing What Shall Constitute Evidence of Due Authority for All Corporate Actions with Reference Thereto.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. (a) Whenever a corporation, organized under
the laws of this state, has heretofore caused or shall hereafter cause to be insured the life of any director, officer,
agent or employe, or whenever such corporation is named
as a beneficiary in or assignee of any policy of life insurance, due authority to effect, assign, release, relinquish, convert, surrender, change the beneficiary, or to take any other
or different action with reference to such insurance, shall
be sufficiently evidenced to the insurance company by a

10 written statement to that effect, signed by the president or 11 the secretary or other corresponding officer of such corpo12 ration, under its corporate seal. Such statement shall be 13 binding upon such corporation and shall protect the insur14 ance company concerned in any act done or suffered by it 15 upon the faith thereof without further inquiry into the 16 validity of the corporate authority or the regularity of the 17 corporate proceedings.

- (b) No person shall be disqualified, by reason of interest
 2 in the subject matter, from acting as a director or as a
 3 member of the executive committee of such corporation on
 4 any corporate act touching such insurance.
- Sect. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 2 and after its passage and publication.
