STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the State Board of Mothers' Aid.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Chapter 222, Section 11, Public Laws of 1917, as amended 2 by Chapter 17, 1919, is hereby amended by striking out the 3 word "one-half" and inserting in lieu thereof the word 'two-4 thirds,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as 5 follows:

'Towns to be reimbursed. Any city, town or plantation 2 rendering aid under the provisions of this act, shall be reim-3 bursed by the state for two-thirds of the amount expended 4 after approval by the state board and the state auditor of 5 its bills. If the mother so aided has no settlement, the city 6 or town shall be reimbursed for the total amount of the

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7 aid given after approval of the bill as aforesaid. If the 8 mother so aided has a lawful settlement in another city or 9 town, the amount of such aid rendered may be recovered by 10 the city or town giving it in an action against the city or 11 town liable therefor, provided the city or town so liable was 12 notified in accordance with the requirements of section 13 thirty-three of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes, 14 or against the kindred of the mother and children so aided 15 in the manner provided by section thirty-three.'

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
