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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

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AN ACT Relative to School Transportation.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph III, section 9, chapter 173, public laws, 1921,  
2 Maine, is hereby amended by striking out in the first and  
3 second lines of said paragraph the words "after this act  
4 becomes effective," so that said paragraph when thus amend-  
5 ed shall read as follows, viz:

'Whenever any school is closed or suspended as provided  
2 for by section two of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes  
3 and pupils attending such school have been conveyed to  
4 another school under such conditions of conveyance as may  
5 be approved by the state superintendent of public schools,

6 there may be apportioned to the town in which such school  
7 was maintained such amount as, added to the amount appor-  
8 tioned under the provisions of section six of this act on  
9 account of teaching positions, will give to said town, on  
10 account of said school, the same amount as though this po-  
11 sition had been maintained for the entire year. Provided,  
12 further, that so long as said school remains closed and sat-  
13 isfactory conveyance is maintained there may be appor-  
14 tioned the same amount as for the maintenance of a teach-  
15 ing position, provided, however, that the amount so appor-  
16 tioned shall not exceed one-half the cost of such convey-  
17 ance.'
