STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Providing for the State to Take Over All Bridges in the State Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. All bridges wholly within the State of Maine,

which now form a part of the state highways as laid out

and designated by the state highway commission, which

after the first day of January in nineteen hundred twenty
eight become the property of the State of Maine in con
sideration said state maintaining and repairing the same. All

such bridges which are under construction on said first day

for January in nineteen hundred twenty-eight, which when

completed become the property of the State of Maine in

consideration of said maintaining and repairing the same.

- 11 All such bridges and all bridges hereafter built or rebuilt, 12 which form a part of such state highways, shall be con-13 structed at the expense of said state.
- Sect. 2. The maintenance, repairs and renewals upon the 2 bridges mentioned in section one hereof, shall be at the ex-3 pense of said state.
- Sect. 3. The funds for meeting the expenses upon the 2 construction, reconstruction and maintenance of the 3 bridges, mentioned in section one hereof, shall be taken from 4 the following sources and in the following proportions, to 5 wit: Fifty per cent from the bonds issued by the State of 6 Maine for the construction of bridges and fifty per cent 7 from the direct appropriations made by the state.
- Sect. 4. All acts and parts of acts, so far as the same are 2 inconsistent, are hereby repealed.
