STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Prevent Trespassing upon Lands Owned by and Used by Any Water Company or Municipal Corporation Engaged in Furnishing Water for Domestic Consumption.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Whoever wilfully commits any trespass, or

knowingly authorizes or employs another to do so, upon

any lands, improved or unimproved, owned by and used

by any water company or municipal corporation engaged

in furnishing water for domestic consumption, that lies

within the watershed of any lake, pond, or reservoir used

as a source of supply for water so furnished, shall be pun
sished by fine not exceeding twenty dollars, and section

twenty-two of chapter one hundred twenty-nine of the re
vised statutes shall apply to this section.

Sect. 2. Provided that the owner of said lands shall cause 2 signs bearing the words "No Trespassing" to be conspicu-3 ously posted on said premises.
