STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Pay of Jurors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eight of chapter one hundred eighteen of the re-
2 vised statutes, as amended by chapter thirty-six of the pub-
3 lic laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is hereby further
4 amended by striking out the word "four" in the fourth line
5 of said section, and inserting in place thereof the word
6 'seven,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as fol-
7 lows:

'Sect. 8. Per diem of jurors increased to seven dollars.
2 Grand and traverse jurors, attending the supreme judicial

3 court or superior courts, and jurors attending on any other
4 occasion prescribed by law, shall each be allowed seven dol-
5 lars a day for their attendance, and six cents a mile for their
6 travel out and home, to be paid out of the county treasury.'
