STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Establish the Narragansett Game Sanctuary in
the Town of Gorham, in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall, except as herein provided, at
2 any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal or
3 any game or wild bird within the following described ter-
4 ritory situated in the town of Gorham, in the county of
5 Cumberland: Bounded on the north by the right of way
6 of the W. N. & P. division of the Boston and Maine rail-
7 road; on the east by the Black Brook road or Scarboro
8 road, so-called, in said town of Gorham; on the south by
9 the Stroudwater river; and on the west by South street
10 or South Gorham road, so-called, in said town of Gorham,
11 containing 3600 acres more or less.

Sect. 2. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have
2 in possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal taken
3 in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. The provisions of this act shall not prohibit any
2 person residing within the limits of the above described
3 sanctuary from shooting at or destroying any wild bird or any
4 wild animal when found destroying his property, nor shall
5 it be construed to prohibit the trapping of fur-bearing ani-
6 mals within the above described sanctuary in accordance
7 with the general laws of the state.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than
3 three hundred dollars and costs for each offense or im-
4 prisonment for sixty days, or both said fine and imprison-
5 ment.

Sect. 5. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game
2 is empowered to enlarge the territory of this sanctuary upon
3 the written consent of the owners of the additional land to
4 be included.
