STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Prohibiting Business and Recreation on Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five of chapter one hundred and twenty-six 2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all

- 3 of said section and by substituting therefor the following
- 4 section:
 - 'Sect. 35. Whoever on Sunday keeps open or conducts
- 2 his place of business, or does any work or labor for hire;
- 3 conducts any sport, show, game or recreation; or is present
- 4 at any dancing, public diversion, show or entertainment, en-
- 5 couraging the same, shall be punished by a fine not exceed-
- 6 ing ten dollars; provided, however, that this section shall

7 not apply to operating railroads, steam or electric, steam-8 ships or ferry-boats; to the driving of taxi cabs or public 9 carriages; to printing and selling Sunday newspapers; to 10 the keeping open of hotels, restaurants, garages, drug, to-11 bacco or confectionery stores; or to the selling of gasoline; 12 to giving scientific, philosophical, religious, or educational 13 lectures; to conducting or taking part in musical concerts. 14 And provided also, that this section shall not apply to ama-15 teur baseball games, golf, hockey, track and other amateur 16 field sports, in cities or towns, where such games and sports 17 are permitted by vote of the municipal officers of said cities 18 and towns.'
