STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Sixty-eight of Chapter Forty-five of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Use of Purse or Drag Seines in Certain Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section sixty-eight of chapter forty-five of the revised stat
utes is hereby amended by striking out all of said section

and by substituting therefor the following section:

'Sect. 68. No person shall use any purse or drag seines 2 in any of the waters of the state north of a line drawn east-3 erly from Prince's Point, in the town of Yarmouth, to Tem-4 ple's Ledge southwest of Cape Small Point, in the town of

5 Phippsburg; and from said Temple's Ledge to Mile Ledge 6 south of Seguin Island, in said town of Phippsburg; and 7 from said Mile Ledge to the southerly point of Damiscove 8 Island in the town of Boothbay Harbor; and from the south-9 erly point of Damiscove Island to Pemaquid Point, in the 10 town of Bristol; in Medomak river, above a line drawn II from Martin's point in the town of Friendship, westerly by 12 the northeast end of Hog island to a point opposite in the 13 town of Bremen, or take smelts in said river and its tribu-14 taries in any other way than by hook and line; in Georges 15 river, above a line drawn from Hooper's point in the town 16 of St. George, westerly past the northerly end of Caldwell's 17 island to a point opposite on the shore in the town of Cush-18 ing, or take smelts in said river and its tributaries in any 19 other way than by hook and line, or dip-nets, and no indi-20 vidual shall take more than one-half bushel of smelts within 21 a period of twenty-four hours with dip-net; in all bays, 22 inlets, rivers and harbors east of the west shore of the 23 Penobscot bay and river where any entrance to the same 24 or any part thereof from mainland to mainland is not more 25 than three nautical miles in width, but purse and drag seines 26 may be used for the purpose of taking smelts in these wa-27 ters, except in Bluehill bay. The taking of herring, or fish-28 ing therefor, by the use of purse or drag seines and all 29 other seines or nets, except the use of seines or nets in 30 weirs, from the first day of June to the first day of No-31 vember in the waters of Machias bay and its approaches

32 inside of or to the northward of a direct line drawn straight 33 from the highest summit of the island called The Brothers, 34 easterly to a point one-half mile distant and due south from 35 Libby island lighthouse, thence from said point easterly to 36 the southerly extremity of the southern island called Double 37 Head Shots, is hereby prohibited. The use of purse or drag 38 seines within a distance of one-half of a nautical mile from 30 any fish weir in any of the waters of the state east of 40 White Head on the west shore of Penobscot river is here-41 by prohibited; but such seines may be used for the taking 42 of smelts and for the purpose of taking fish in weirs, but 43 shall not be used in any water in which their use is pro-44 hibited by special or general law. Whoever violates any 45 provision of this section shall be liable to a penalty not 46 exceeding five hundred dollars for each offense, to be re-47 covered by complaint, indictment or action of debt.'
