## STATE OF MAINE

---

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

---

AN ACT Relating to Non-Resident Fishermen.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter sixty-six of the public laws of nine-  
2 teen hundred seventeen, as amended by chapter two hundred  
3 and one of the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one,  
4 is hereby amended by striking out the word "sixteen" in  
5 the third line of said section and by substituting therefor  
6 the word 'twelve,' so that said section as amended shall read  
7 as follows:

'Section 1. Persons not bona fide residents of the state,  
2 and not actually domiciled therein, except children under  
3 twelve years of age, shall not fish for, take, catch or kill  
4 any kind of fish at any time in any of the inland waters of

5 the state, or have the same or any part thereof in posses-  
6 sion, without first having procured a license therefor as  
7 hereinafter provided. Such licenses shall be of such form  
8 and style as may be prescribed by the commissioner of in-  
9 land fisheries and game, and shall be issued by town clerks  
10 and other agents appointed by said commissioner, under  
11 such regulations as may be established by said commis-  
12 sioner, upon application in writing on blanks to be furnished  
13 by said commissioner and payment of a fee of three dollars  
14 and fifteen cents.'
