STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Trapping of Fur-bearing Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P. L. 1917, c. 219, sec. 52; 1919, c. 196; 1923, c. 76; re-

- 2 lating to visiting traps set in organized places, amended.
- 3 Section fifty-two of chapter two hundred and nineteen of
- 4 the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, as
- 5 amended by chapter one hundred and ninety-six of the pub-
- 6 lic laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen and by chapter
- 7 seventy-six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and
- 8 twenty-three, and by chapter sixty-seven of the public laws
- 9 of nineteen hundred and twenty-five, is hereby further
- 10 amended by striking out all of said section and by substi-
- 11 tuting therefor the following section:

'Sect. 52. Consent of owner of land required in all cases; 2 trapping of beaver not excepted; fine increased. Any per-3 son setting a trap in any organized or incorporated place 4 shall visit said trap, or cause the same to be visited, at least 5 once in every twenty-four hours, and remove therefrom or 6 cause to be removed, any animal found caught therein. No 7 person shall set a trap or traps in any organized or incor-8 porated place without first obtaining the written consent of 9 the owner or occupant of the land on which said trap or 10 traps are to be set. Whoever violates any provision of this 11 section shall pay a fine of not less than ten, nor more than 12 one hundred dollars and costs for each offense.'
