STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Appropriate Money to Aid in the Screening of Alford's Lake, in the County of Knox.

Resolved: That the sum of sixty-nine dollars and seventy-2 eight cents (\$69.78) be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be 3 paid to the Knox County Fish and Game Association, Rock-4 land, Maine, to reimburse said association for one-half of

5 the expense of installing a screen at the outlet of Alford's

6 lake, in the county of Knox.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The situation is fully set forth in the original resolve, and vote of said association, agreeing to keep said screen clear of all debris at all times, is on file with the original resolve.

It became necessary at short notice to install a screen at the outlet of this lake, in order to preserve the fish, and the association assumed the expense, which was \$139.57, and simply asks the state to reimburse it for one-half the amount expenses, as is done when appropriations are made for the installation of such screens.

Excerpts from the Minutes of the Monthly Meeting of the Knox County Fish and Game Association, held January 6th, 1927, Rockland, Maine, taken from the Record Book, Page 113.

Upon a motion, duly made and seconded, it was voted that the Knox County Fish and Game Association assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the screen.
