AN ACT Relating to Non-resident Moose Hunting Licenses.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-nine of chapter two hundred and nineteen  
2 of the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven-  
3 teen, as amended by chapter two hundred and forty-four  
4 of the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven-  
5 teen, as amended by chapter one hundred and ninety-six  
6 of the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and nine-  
7 teen, as amended by chapter two hundred and eighteen of  
8 the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and twenty-  
9 one, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifteen of the  
10 public laws of one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three

11 is hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph of  
12 said section the following:

‘To hunt bull moose during the open season and in the  
2 manner provided by law, a license fee of twenty-five dollars  
3 shall be paid annually and the license issued on payment  
4 of such fee shall be known as the non-resident moose hunt-  
5 ing license and said license shall be provided with two moose  
6 coupons lettered “AA” and “BB,” respectively, which will  
7 permit the transfer to home of owner of said license, under  
8 provisions of sections thirty-seven and sixty-one of this  
9 chapter, as amended, the carcass of one bull moose, or part  
10 thereof, which the holder of said license has legally killed.’
