STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Non-resident Moose Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section fifty-nine of chapter two hundred and nineteen
2 of the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven3 teen, as amended by chapter two hundred and forty-four
4 of the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven5 teen, as amended by chapter one hundred and ninety-six
6 of the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and nine7 teen, as amended by chapter two hundred and eighteen of
8 the public laws of one thousand nine hundred and twenty9 one, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifteen of the
10 public laws of one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three

11 is hereby amended by inserting after the first paragraph of12 said section the following:

'To hunt bull moose during the open season and in the 2 manner provided by law, a license fee of twenty-five dollars 3 shall be paid annually and the license issued on payment 4 of such fee shall be known as the non-resident moose hunt-5 ing license and said license shall be provided with two moose 6 coupons lettered "AA" and "BB," respectively, which will 7 permit the transfer to home of owner of said license, under 8 provisions of sections thirty-seven and sixty-one of this 9 chapter, as amended, the carcass of one bull moose, or part 10 thereof, which the holder of said license has legally killed.'

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
